Bridle Measuring Guide

COUNTRY & STABLE

A well-fitting equestrian bridle is essential for the horse's comfort, communication, and performance. A properly adjusted bridle prevents discomfort, rubbing, and potential injuries, ensuring the horse can respond to the rider's cues effectively. It enhances control and safety by allowing better contact with the bit, helping the rider guide the horse smoothly. A bridle that fits well promotes trust and harmony between horse and rider, leading to better overall performance.



Headpiece

With your current bridle on your horse measure from the base of the ear, over the top of the horses head to the other side. If you are in between sizes go up a size.



Browband

Check if your current browband fits well by ensuring you can fit one finger under its front without being too tight. Measure its length and choose a larger size if your browband is snug.



Cheekpieces

Measure from the upper corner of the horse's eye downwards towards the top of the bit ring.



Measure the circumference 1 fingers width below the cheekbone.



Grackle Noseband

Measure from the corner of the cheekbone to the opposite side under the chin to the opposite cheekbone, creating a figure 8 on the horses face.
